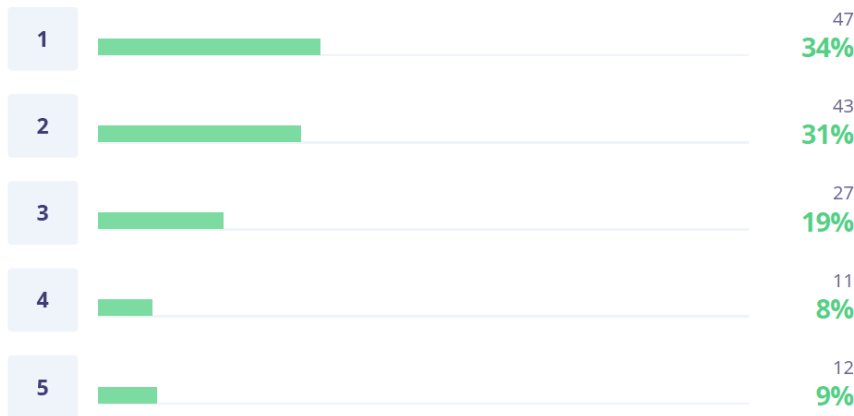


Recent studies have identified multiple locations in Shotton that would benefit from green improvements such as trees, planting, methods to reduce flooding, improving air quality and visual appeal.

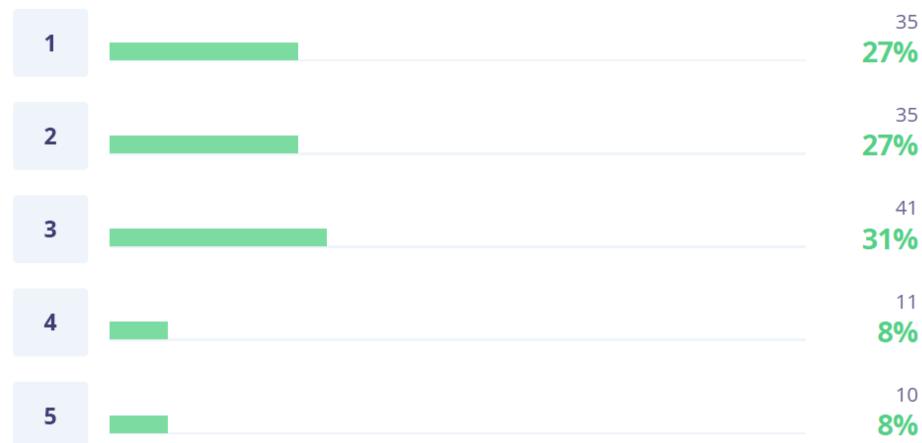
