1. Introduction

This document presents two Flood Action Plans prepared by Flintshire County Council (FCC). The Flood Action Plans are based on Flintshire's Local Flood Risk Management Strategy (LFRMS), which also includes their Flood Risk Management Plan (FRMP). Each plan sets out actions FCC propose to deliver over the life of their LFRMS to ensure each objective is achieved.

Each flood action has an associated timescale and cost for delivery. The timeline is determined by priority, the scope of work involved and the resources available. The indicative costs and timescales are detailed below:

Timescales

Short Term: 0 - 2 years
Medium Term: 3 - 5 years
Long Term: 6 - 10 years

Cost

Existing Resources (ER): No cost implication, within current budgets

Very Low Cost: £0 - £10,000
 Low Cost: £10,001 - £30,000
 Medium Cost: £30,001 - £100,000

High Cost: £101,000 - £500,000
 Very High Cost: £500,000 +

Policy Action Plan

The Policy Action Plan sets out the proposed actions which will have an overarching effect on the whole of the county. Actions include developing new policies in relation to flood risk management, improving the SAB application process and facilitating collaboration. Actions do not include site specific or regional works to manage flood risk.

Community Specific Action Plan

The Community Specific Action Plan has been prepared based on the outputs of the FRMP. At risk areas of flooding have been identified based on the number of assets affected as well as the assigned risk classification. Each area has been reviewed, with specific actions identified.
