Target Note WARRHALLT001

Species rich semi-improved grassland in a field to the north east of Lester's Lane and along the steep roadside embankment along the south west of the Lane. The field also contains young scattered scrub and an area of tall ruderal vegetation. Caterpillars for five-spot burnet is abundant throughout the site feeding on a variety of trefoils.

Target Note WARRHALLT002

The site borders a semi-natural broad-leaved woodland containing mature oak, ash, sycamore and cherry.

Target Note WARRHALLT003

A large waterbody created for boating with a small island containing trees in the centre. The waterbody is surrounded by woodland on all sides, which includes some ornamental species. although there is still open water in the centre of the waterbody due to it's size. There was no visible emergent or submergent vegetation visible at the time of survey.

A pair of canada geese with 6 goslings and mallards were observed during the survey.

Two non-native invasive species were recorded around the waterbody: Japanese knotweed and Rhododendron.

Target Note WARRHALLT004

Flooded area of the field but not thought to be permanent. Will probably dry up during the drier months.

Target Note WARRHALLT005

Mixed plantation woodland with broken fences surrounding it, meaning that the grazing cattle have full access throughout the woodland. There is a limited variety of ground flora, with damp and boggy areas within the undulating terrain, and it is heavily poached by the cattle in some areas.

Target Note WARRHALLT006

Pheasant rearing pens.

Target Note WARRHALLT007

Brook running from east to west through the south of the site.

The brook runs through several habitats within the site: through the full length of a plantation woodland; out into an area of marshy grassland within cattle grazed fields; then into a linear strip of scrub which progresses into a strip of broad-leaved woodland.

The variety of flora along the banks of the brook alters as it goes through the various habitats.

The banks of the brook are steep in many places and it has a stone and silt base.
