MAC101

Policy EN15 states the following under Water Resources Item d): Development affecting water resources will only be permitted if:

'd. there is no adverse effect on the integrity of the River Dee and Bala Lake SAC in particular through the treatment of waste water. To ensure no adverse effect on the integrity of the River Dee and Bala Lake SAC, development creating waste water discharges will be required to demonstrate there is no increase in phosphorus levels in the SAC'.

There is no information on the uncertainty of the Phosphorus concern for the 4 allocated sites in the LDP which would require mitigation measures, or the consequences to housing delivery if the 4 sites were not developed.

Detail of the 4 affected sites

HN1.1 Well Street, Buckley 140 Revised yield - see MAC115
HN1.6 Denbigh Rd / Gwernaffield Rd, Mold 238 Revised yield - see MAC115
HN1.9 Wrexham Road, HCAC 80 As per Deposit Plan
HN1.10 Cae Isa, New Brighton 92 Revised yield - see MAC115
Total 550

There is a high degree of uncertainty for these mitigation measures, the HRA Addendum item 5 says this:

"To be taken fully into account, at the appropriate stages, all 'mitigation measures' should be effective, reliable, timely, guaranteed to be delivered and as long term as they need to be to achieve their objectives".

The Council say in their letter to the Inspector FCC035 Item 7: There is insufficient information at this time to assess with certainty the respective costs of these various mitigation measures, their likely development and in what time frame, The above gives a couple of examples of the high degree of uncertainty on the cost of mitigation measures, this cost could have a negative impact on the viability of the 4 sites, The MAC should detail the effect of the 4 sites not being delivered and its impact on housing delivery, fortunately it has been calculated and is stated in the Councils letter to the Inspector FCC035 as follows: The 4 allocated sites are planned to develop 550 units, if these are removed from the LDP, together with other adjustments, it would be a net reduction of 396 units, the housing balance sheet shows there are currently 920 units over allocated, if we remove the 396 there is an over allocation of 524 units (12.1%) to deliver the remaining 4341 units, the Council say if the 4 allocated sites do not come forward there is still more than sufficient sustainable housing, supported by a healthy flexibility allowance, to ensure the delivery of the remaining LDP housing requirement of 4,341 units. The above would be useful detail to be added to MAC101 to show the uncertainty of mitigation measures and the effect if the 4 affected sites were removed from the LDP.
