Settlement Commentary

Saltney is situated on the eastern edge of the County, on the border of England and the City of Chester. Putting local authority boundaries aside, Saltney is visually part of the urban fabric of Chester. The settlement is served by a wide array of services and facilities and has significant retail provision as well as being located close to Chester City Centre, a significant sub-regional commercial and employment centre.

Broadband Provision

According to the latest OFCOM data (2013) Saltney post codes (where data is available) have a median average broadband range of 1.1-23.4 mega-bytes per second with most postcodes at 3 - 6mbps. This level of broadband provision is poor. Accordingly it is to be expected that broadband provision in Saltney is poor and is constrained. This will have a negative effect on the ability of businesses and local residents seeking to operate a business or in accessing online services such as banking, post office services or online shopping.

Other Comments

Saltney has an extensive area of industrial units, some of which are in alternative uses. For example, there are a number of non-food retail units on the Brymau Estate on River Lane, which diversify the service provision offer. Go Outdoors was also formerly an industrial unit and the land adjacent has planning permission for 3 large retail units (around 4,000 square meters) this has yet to be implemented. Another unit nearby houses Whizz Kids, children's play centre, and is a popular destination and includes a café for patrons.


It is reported that St Mark's Church in Hough Green, Chester serves Flintshire residents despite being located to the east of the County boundary in England.

Previous Surveys of Service Provision

Saltney is one of 8 key town and district centres within Flintshire. Extensive data exists for Saltney dating back to 1997 which illustrates that Saltney has significant retail and commercial premises centred around Marley Way Trading Park and Victoria Road. In more recent years the loss of the Morrisons at River Lane has seen the arrival of Go Outdoors and the building of a new Morrisons on Saltney High Street near Victoria Road. Beyond Saltney near Boundary Lane there are additional services and facilities within Chester (England).

Mapping Service Provision

Some of the service provision within the town has been mapped for illustrative purposes and is presented overleaf. As the image suggests service provision in Saltney is excellent and the close proximity of Chester further improves opportunities to access services, facilities and employment immensely.



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
