

## TREUDDYN - SETTLEMENT SERVICE AUDIT

### Settlement Commentary

Treuddyn is a small village located some 9 km (by road) from Mold. The village is in a relatively isolated and undeveloped part of the County and benefits from an attractive rural setting. The built form of the village is relatively easily defined. Services and facilities within the village are relatively good but the closure of the Farmers Arms represents a loss of services and is a recognised blow to the community.

## Broadband Provision

According to the latest OFCOM data (2013) Treuddyn post codes (where data is available) have a median average broadband range of 1.8 - 5.5 mega bytes per second with most postcodes at or below 3 mbps. Accordingly it is to be expected that broadband provision in Treuddyn is very poor and highly constrained with residents likely to struggle to gain broadband speeds. This will have a negative effect on local businesses in their day to day activities and on local residents seeking to access online services such as banking, post office services or online shopping.

## Other Comments

Treuddyn is located in an isolated rural area of Flintshire.

## Previous Surveys of Service Provision

Previous surveys of Treuddyn indicate that since 2000 a cashmachine has been fitted in the post office / shop, but the Farmers Arms (the local pub) has closed.
