Who are we?

Flintshire County Council are responsible for all the schools in our area.

We are part of a team that work for the Council to support schools.



Our Aims

- To give all children the best chance to learn in excellent schools in our area.
- To have safe and strong school buildings.
- To make sure money for children and schools in our area is spent in a fair way.
- To give everyone the opportunity to have their voice heard and listened to, in decisions that affect them.



Changes

It is not always possible for every school to stay as they are and sometimes this means the Council needs to make some important changes.

Changes can help to give everyone the best chance to learn, in the best possible school.



What does this mean?

We are looking at **a number** of options for schools in the area.

Option 1 – Do nothing. All schools remain as they are and repairs are paid for when needed by Flintshire County Council and Welsh Government, if money is available.



What does this mean?

Option 2 – Do the minimum. All schools remain as they are and outstanding repairs are paid for by Flintshire County Council and Welsh Government, if money is available.



What does this mean?

Option 3 – Flintshire County Council and Welsh Government pay for certain schools in the Saltney and Broughton area to be made bigger and to be redecorated. Which schools will depend on the number of children in each one and the chance of the school becoming full.



What does this mean?

Option 4 – Build a school for 3 – 16 year old children. St David's High School, Saltney Ferry CP and Saltney Wood Memorial School would come together on one site meaning there would be one high school and one primary school.

Broughton CP will stay the same.



What does this mean?

Option 5 – Build a new school for St David’s High and combine Saltney Ferry CP and Saltney Wood Memorial School into a new school on another site.

Broughton CP will stay the same.



What does this mean?

Option 6 – Take the difficult decision to close St David’s High School and provide pupils with a place at another high school in Flintshire due to the low number of pupils currently in the school.

Pupils at St David’s High School would move to another school.

A new primary school to combine Saltney Ferry CP and Saltney Wood Memorial School could be built on the St David’s High School site.


